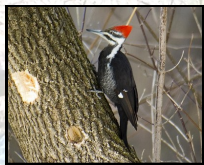

**Park Hours**

Open:  
dawn until dusk  
7 days a week  
year-round



The floating dock is free to the public with a 48 hour mooring time limit.

**Projects in Progress**

**Sensory Trail:** volunteers and a professional design team will enhance the Park's River Walk Sensory Trail with accessible stations that can be enjoyed by all.

**Dix Bridge Rebirth:** this historic bridge, once slated for demolition, will be restored to serve as the local Hudson River recreational crossing for the New York State Canalway Trail, linking pedestrian, bicycle, and snowmobile trails of Saratoga and Washington Counties.

**Proposed Environmental Education Center and Great Hall:** this complex will provide classrooms for hands-on experiments, interactive exhibits, and laboratories for innovative eco-research, as well as conference and reception space. The facility will be designed to showcase sustainable practices and will be a model of environmental stewardship.

**The Park Mission**

The mission of Hudson Crossing Park is to tie environmental responsibility to economic revitalization, and to engage people of all ages in making informed choices for a sustainable future.

To achieve our mission we have three objectives:

- ♻️ To foster environmental stewardship

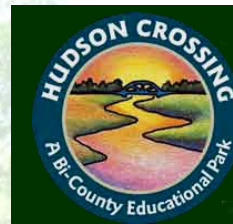
