Clean and remove all visible plants, animals, fish, and mud from your boat, trailer, or other equipment and dispose of in a suitable trash container or on dry land.




Drain water from bilge, live wells, ballast tanks, and any other locations with water before leaving the launch.



Dry your boat, trailer, and all equipment completely. Drying times vary depending on the weather and the type of material. At least five days of drying time is generally recommended during the summer.

Invasive Species to Look Out For:



Water Chestnut

- Triangular leaves with toothed edges
- Forms dense floating mats
- Seeds & plants attach to trailers



Zebra/Quagga Mussel

- Tiny, "D" or oval shaped striped shells
- Covers hard surfaces & sharp shells cut feet
- Attach to plants, boats, and hard surfaces



Eurasian Watermilfoil

- Feathery leaves in whorls of 4
- · Forms dense beds
- Plant fragments attach to boats & trailers



Spiny Waterflea

- \bullet Tiny, $\frac{1}{2}$ "crustacean with long, barbed tail
- $\bullet \ \, \text{Competes with fish for food}$
- Masses collect on fishing line



Hydrilla

- Blade-like leaves in whorls of 4-8
- Forms dense beds
- Plant fragments attach to boats & trailers



Live Bait

- Non-native crayfish and minnows
- Alters aquatic habitats & may carry pathogens
- Often released or illegally stocked



Asian Clam

- Small, round gold/brown shell with ridges
- Outcompetes native mollusks
- Microscopic juveniles transported in water
